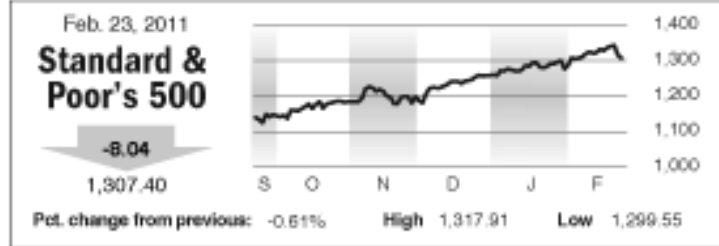
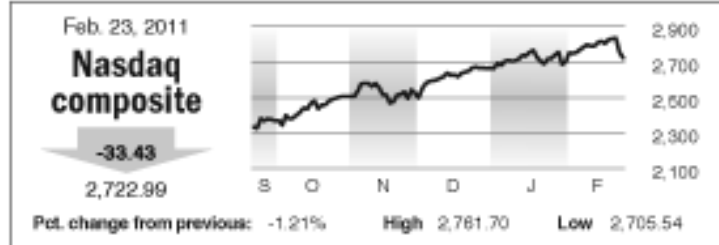
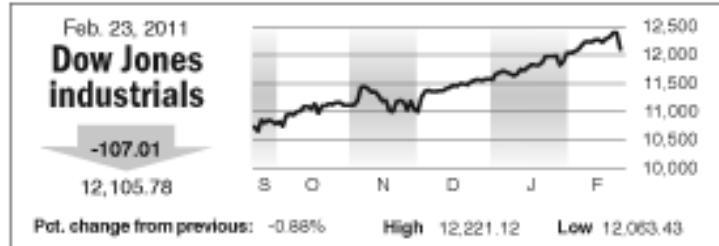

Libya, H-P earnings hurt stocks

Stocks had their worst two-day pullback in six months after clashes in Libya sent oil prices to two-year highs and Hewlett-Packard said its revenue growth was slowing.

The unrest sent oil up to \$98 a barrel Wednesday, its highest price since October 2008. Libya is the world's 15th largest exporter of crude. Traders are worried the revolt could threaten oil production and spread to other countries.

The Dow Jones industrial average lost 107.01 points, or 0.9 percent, to 12,105.78. The Dow has fallen 285.47 points, or 2.3 percent, over the last two days. The S&P 500 fell 8.04, or 0.6 percent, to 1,307.40. The Nasdaq composite fell 33.43, or 1.2 percent, to 2,722.99.

Technology stocks fell after Hewlett-Packard Co. gave a disappointing revenue forecast for the current fiscal year. The stock fell 9.6 percent, the most out of the 30 that make up the Dow average.

A diverse year for a new facility in Norwalk

It's been quite a first year for the Sono Field House.

The indoor sports facility in South Norwalk has played host to political fundraisers (including one with Bill Clinton), corporate galas, sports clinics with some of America's top athletes, and thousands of children who have honed their sports skills.

"We're pleased with where we are after a year and we're working to get better and improve the value to the community," Jim Quinn of owner Q Properties said. "A positive surprise is that it's really a positive for Fairfield County. We feel fortunate that there hasn't been any negative surprises."

The bread-and-butter of the facility is sports training — especially youth training — but it is becoming known as a place to hold large events. Pepperidge Farm held a corporate party for about 500 people, Norwalk Hospital's gala had about 400 people, and a Jim Himes fundraiser that included Bill Clinton drew hundreds of people.

So, too, has sports been a big attraction. A clinic put on by lacrosse star Paul Rabil attracted about 350 people, Quinn said.

The large events keep coming. On March 19 and 20, the Sono Field House will play host to the 31st annual Fairfield County Home Show, the area's largest home event. Vendors include home builders and



remodelers, kitchen and bath manufacturers, window companies and furniture makers.

"They're excited and we are as well," Quinn said. "It's a plus for Norwalk and Fairfield County to have such a prestigious event."

The Norwalk business community has recognized the contributions the facility has made in its first year.

"Sono Field House has had a very positive impact on the greater Norwalk community, and has achieved considerable success at the same time," Brian Griffin, vice president of the Greater Norwalk Chamber

of Commerce, said. "Not only have they been a most valuable resource as an indoor sports facility, but they have also served as a venue for numerous fundraisers, corporate training events and expositions. We are fortunate to have such a treasured facility right here in Norwalk."

The field house also holds birthday parties, bar mitzvahs, and corporate team building. It recently played host to a Dodgeball Party, held in celebration of a 40th birthday party. Several of Norwalk's largest corporations have held team-building outings there. The facility includes a 30-foot climbing wall, a ropes course and a zip line.

The athletic field surface is roughly the size of the football field. It can be divided into three separate fields.

Sono Field House, which opened just over a year ago, already has 3,500 members. It attracts athletes from Norwalk, Stamford, Darien, New Canaan, Westport and other nearby towns. Its primary sports are lacrosse, soccer, field hockey and football.

"Last season we had 3,000 sports participants in youth and high school programs," Quinn said. "Our coaches have high standards and people embrace that."

Sono Field House has also made contributions to the community. It's Beacon Buddies program — a free lacrosse program for inner city first- and second-graders — is starting its second year. Beacon Buddies is one of the initiatives under the business's Students of the World Care non-profit program.
